FINDING HOPE AT VIM

Finding affordable healthcare felt out of reach for Adrian until he discovered Volunteers in Medicine. At VIM, he was welcomed with compassion and surrounded by staff and volunteers who genuinely care. Adrian received help with medications, referrals to specialists, and coordinated care for ongoing pain related to past back injuries—care that ultimately led to surgery and physical therapy. For Adrian, this life-changing care was nothing short of a blessing.

Beyond physical healing, Adrian experienced something unexpected: spiritual encouragement. Volunteers prayed with him and for him, especially during his surgery, reminding him that he was not alone. **“It was very heartfelt to know that I have people praying for me,”** he shared. That care brought him renewed hope, strengthened faith, and the reminder that he is never alone. VIM remains a steady source of care for Adrian.



GROWING TOGETHER AT KC

When the Pina de la Cruz boys—now in 8th and 7th grade—began struggling with homework in elementary school, Kids Club provided the support their family needed, especially with assignments in English. What began as academic help soon led to spiritual growth and new habits at home.

Their younger siblings, Ashley and Miguel are now in KC too, coming home eager to pray like they do at program and gaining the same academic and spiritual encouragement. The impact has been lasting—Manny still has close friendships from his KC years, and Justin still carries encouragement from the Scriptures he learned there.

As KC celebrates 20 years, their mom Mayra shared, **“I have confidence and [believe] in Kids Club because of how it has taught [the kids] spiritually, academically and in friendships.”**
